Governor Scott and Secretary Detzner:

I am writing to respectfully request you withhold from sending the sensitive information, including partial Social Security numbers, of Florida citizens to President Donald Trump's so-called Presidential Advisory Commission on Election Integrity.

This commission is designed to prove something that has already been established as demonstratively false: President Trump's ludicrous claim that 3-5 million Americans voted illegally in the last election.

We can and should all responsibly acknowledge there are some problems with state voting rolls, like White House Chief Strategist Steve Bannon being registered in both Florida and New York, and there is a place for bipartisan cooperation to address the problems that actually exist like foreign interference in the election and the attempted hacking of several Florida supervisor of election offices – but this sham commission was not designed to address real problems, it was created to stroke President Trump's ego.

- Restoration of rights to ex-felons who have served their sentences
